Diversity

Our foster parents come from all backgrounds and are of all ages. We have single foster parents who can offer siblings a home, couples with birth children who support sanctuaryseeking young people, and retired couples supporting teenagers to independence. We recognise the diversity of our families and offer support to all members of the fostering household and support network. This could be birth children, grandparents, friends, or extended family.

It doesn't matter if you're female, male, nonbinary, straight, gay, single, married, divorced, or don't have any experience in working with children. What truly matters is your dedication and commitment to transforming the lives of vulnerable children.

Social Worker Support

You'll develop a strong working relationship with your dedicated supervising social worker. They'll support you by visiting regularly, conducting monthly one-to-one supervision meetings, and helping you access training.

Our high-quality training programmes and annual conferences are accessible and relevant to all our foster parents, enabling you to continue developing your skills and confidence in your role.



Expert Matching

Our dedicated referrals team work alongside all Local Authorities across Yorkshire and the East Midlands to ensure we match the right child to your family. We have an excellent track record for quality matching, ensuring your family and the child who will be in your care have a successful and happy fostering experience together.

Therapy Support

Our therapy team is made up of therapists with different specialist knowledge and are able to bring this to their role in supporting our foster parents and maintaining stability for our children. They offer therapeutic training, one to one consultations and group sessions. All new foster parents will be invited to the Therapeutic Parenting training programme, based on the PACE model and will be provided with a 'Let's Be Curious' session when children are newly placed as part of our aim in providing stability for our children.

Supporting our Children and Young People

Educational Support for Young People

FCA Yorks and Lincs is a registered AOA Unit Award Scheme Centre. This means that children and young people of any age or ability, can complete a range of AQA UAS Units and gain certificates, either through group workshops or independent achievements. Some examples of topics young people can gain AQA certificates in include Diversity and Inclusion, Food Hygiene, Money and Budgeting, Volunteering, and Hair and Beauty. The AOA Award Scheme is a great way to support young people's confidence, selfesteem, and preparation for adulthood. We also offer CV workshops and interview training for our young people, along with career events to give them the opportunity to explore post-16 opportunities and practice key interview preparation skills.

Duke of Edinburgh (DofE)

We are a registered DofE provider which gives our young people the opportunity to socialise, support their community, and learn new skills to support opportunities available to them in the future, including college and university applications, workshops, group exercises, webinars and work experience in the local community.

Participation

We have a strong focus on participation at FCA, where we actively engage our children and young people. We always strive to improve by listening to our children and young people. Children cared for by us are given the opportunity to join our Make the Difference team or mini Make the Difference team where they can influence policy and practice in the region.
